MEASURING IMPACT

Interim assessments are noted each half term and are discussed at progress meetings where all teaching staff are present. Attendance monitored through the schools' policy and the S.A.O meets with the Head Teacher every term.

MONITORING OF PUPIL PREMIUM STRATEGY

- Half termly progress data used to identify intervention/support to be used.
- All interventions are recorded to allow evaluations to take place and comparisons as the children progress through the school.
