<p><b>Carnival of the Animals</b></p>	<p>Locate Lyme Regis in the UK and relate to previous knowledge of the four countries and capitals Use world maps, atlases and globes to locate the 7 continents and 5 oceans linked to the animals</p>	<p>Consider the changes to Lyme Regis since Mary Anning was born there 1799 and present day</p>	<p>Consider knowledge gained about climates in Weather Experts topic and learn about the locations linked to the animals in the music</p>	<p>Learn about the human impact on wildlife; poaching, deforestation etc What can we do about this?</p>
<p><b>Oceans and Seas</b></p>	<p>Recognise the UK on a range of maps, naming and locating the seas that surround the UK as well as the country's 4 constituent nations. Consolidate learning about the 5 oceans and 7 continents of the world Locate them on a map, understanding that the UK lies in the Atlantic Ocean. Locate The Galapagos Islands</p>	<p>Understand that an island is an area of land that is completely surrounded by water.
