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### **REVIEW – September 2021**

**The majority of Pupil Premium children were invited into both schools during Spring term lockdown with most children attending.**

1. Increased frequency of reading will need to continue to address gaps and continue progress
2. Children have benefited from TA support in classrooms and interventions including key words practice, phonics catch up, rapid phonics and rapid reading
3. Three children have accessed Drawing and Talking therapy or pastoral support where required and this has had a positive impact in the classroom and socially
4. Difficult to review attendance due to COVID restrictions however most PP children were invited into school during lockdown
